I am writing as a student at Sheffield University and area representative of the Independent UFO Network, which investigates alleged sightings of "UFOs" in the north of England.

My reason for contacting you is to ask if your Ministry is aware of the numerous sightings of an unidentified delta-volent shaped flying object, carrying a barrage of brilliant lights, over the towns of Derby and Uttoxeter on the nights of Sunday, August I6th and Monday, August I7th, I987 respectively. I have personally interviewed six witnesses who obtained very good views of this object, including a couple who came within I00 feet of it when returning home to Derby on the night of August I6th.

I would like to ask if you can provide any suggestions or explanations as to what was observed on the above nights, and whether there was any military/RAF/NATO exercise or helicopter manoeuvres taking place in the above areas at the stated times. I realise this information may be confidential, but I must stress that I have no wish to know what may have been going on that night, only if there were military aircraft in the area at the time that the Ministry was aware of.

I would also like to ask if the Ministry has received any other reports relating to Unidentified Aerial Phenomena reported during the month of August 1987, and if so whether details could be provided.

I am preparing a detailed dossier containing the relevant details of the cases I have investigated above (including a sighting in Barmsley in which the witness obtained photographs of an unknown flying object which are are the moment being analysed by computer in the USA), and will provide a copy for your Ministry if you feel these incidents are of defence interest.

Dear Sir,

I am compiling a full report on a sighting of two very large Ufos, which were seen, by what I estimate to have been hundreds of people, in Plymouth alone. These Ufos made successive passes over the city between the hours of 10.30pm and 2.00am on the evening of the 4/5th of August.

These two objects had been seen 30 minutes earlier flying at

great height, over Exeter in a NE to SW direction. They were tracked on radar by Air Traffic Control a t Exeter and by people in the town.

I know that in the past the authorities have refused to release any information(with some notable exceptions) but this was such a significant event, that I sincerely hope that you will be able to help me with

some details, if you would be so kind.

A feature of the incident that I am finding hard to clarify, is the height at which the objects were flying and their size. While flying over Plymouth, the witnesses here (myself included) felt that they were at a h height of something between $\frac{1}{4}$ and a $\frac{1}{2}$ a mile, and apparently the size of a jumbo jet. However the two delta shaped objects were seen at the same time in the Plymouth direction, from Bude on the north coast, a distance of 40 miles away. and flying. I should think we can take the word of a wartime RAF man, eh?
So would it be possible for you to give me any information regarding the height, size and speed with which you tracked these objects?

Were any aircraft sent up to investigate these Ufos? If not, what criteria do you use for deciding whether to invest-

igate unknown aircraft entering our air-space?

And following that what do you suggest I say to all these peo-

ple, who ask me what is the RAF doing about these things?

Believe me this was avery impressive "display"by a very impressive unknown flying aircraft, of which three sets of photographs were taken that I know of, and as I was writing this I have just had a phone call from further along the Devon coast of a lot of Ufo activity in the last two weeks. Helicopters being seen the following day circling the area, where Ufo was seen. I don't know what you may know, but I have a strong feeling that this Ufo activity will be increasing in the future. This is after an 18 month hull in Ufo activity over the Plymouth area. Any ideas on this?







Close encounters of an alien kind

BODIES of four 'aliens' from a crashed UFO (unidentified flying object) were recovered and examined by a special American Government team 40 years ago, according to a top-secret 'document' obtained by a British researcher.

A bitter debate is now likely to develop among UFO experts over the existence of a mysterious committee, code-named Majestic-12, which is supposed to have examined the aliens.

The highly classified briefing paper claims that the then head of the CIA, Admiral Roscoe Hillenkoetter, reported that 'although these creatures are human-like in appearance, the biological and evolutionary processes responsible for their development have apparently been quite different from those observed or postulated in homo sapiens.'

The document, which has been shown to *The Observer* by Timothy Good, Britain's leading UFO researcher, purports to be a briefing paper for President-elect Eisenhower on Operation Majestic-12, also known as MJ-12.

In his book, 'Above Top Secret:
The Worldwide UFO Cover-up,' to
be published by Sidgwick & Jackson
on 9 July, Mr Good claims that MJ-12
was a committee of senior US officials
which investigated and then covered

up news of flying saucer crashes.

Other UFO experts believe the story could be a hoax involving the planting of 2 fake supporting White House memo in the files of Air Force Intelligence and then getting the National Archives officially to declassify a forged document.

The Eisenhower briefing paper, dated 18 November, 1952, claims the MJ-12 committee had been set up by his predecessor, President Truman, on 24 September, 1947, as a 'top secret research and development/intelligence operation responsible directly and only to the President of the United States.'

The document reports that on 24 June 1947, 'disc-shaped aircraft' were sighted in the United States.

'Little was learned about the objects until a local rancher reported that one had crashed in a remote region of New Mexico, about 75 miles north-west of Roswell Army Air Base (now Walker Field).

On 7 July 1947, a secret operation was begun to assure recovery of the wreckage of this object for scientific study. During the course of this operation, aerial reconnaissance discovered that four small human-like beings had apparently ejected from the craft at some point before it exploded. These had fallen to earth about two miles east of the wreckage

According to the briefing paper:
'All four were dead and badly decomposed due to action by predators and exposure to the elements during the approximately one week of time which had elapsed before their discovery.

'A covert analytical effort resulted in a preliminary consensus (19 September 1947) that the disc was most likely a short-range reconnaissance craft . . .

The Majestic-12 Group remains of the unanimous opinion that imposition of the strictest security precautions should continue without interruption into the new Administration. Inquiries by The Observer at the National Archives, the archives of former Presidents Truman and Eisenhower, and the National Security Council archives, have been unable to authenticate the briefing paper. They all say that extensive searches have failed to locate copies of the document.

There is, however, new evidence from the files of US Intelligence that a secret group called MJ-12 did exist. This is a White House memorandum to General Twining informing him about an 'MJ-12' briefing for President Eisenhower. It was declassified on 12 January 1987.

The White House memorandum was described by the National

Inquiries by The Observer at the Archives last week as 'a very strange ational Archives, the archives of document.'

Archivist Joanna Williamson said:

It was found in the files of the US Air
Force's Director of Intelligence and is
certainly genuine, but we have found
no minutes of the MJ-12 meeting,
which was scheduled for just two days
later. It is very surprising that there
are no other papers on MJ-12, and we
have no idea what it was.

If the White House memorandum is genuine, this proves the existence of an MJ-12 group whose responsibility could have covered UFOs. This would then strengthen Mr Good's view that there was a cover-up of the discovery of dead aliens. However, US UFO writer Mr Bary Greenwood has raised an intriguing question suggesting that there could have been a very sophisticated fraud.

There are some things that look wrong with the White House memo. For example, it is unsigned. It is just possible that it was manufactured by someone wanting to prove the existence of MJ-12 and then inserted into Air Force Intelligence records which had recently been opened up to the public.

'The hoaxer could then have ordered a copy from the National Archives which would carry the official declassification stamp. MJ-12 may well have existed but more research is needed to authenticate the documents,' he said.
